

PAINTING YOUR METAL GARAGE DOOR



Garage Doors By Dan does not recommend painting your garage door after installation. This document is intended to inform property owners of the potential risks and consequences associated with painting a garage door after installation.

1. Risk of Poor Finish

This can include visible brush or roller marks, poor adhesion to the factory coating, early fading or discoloration.

2. Peeling and Flaking Paint

Improper surface preparation, incompatible paint products, or environmental conditions during application can lead to the paint bubbling, blistering, peeling and /or flaking off. Once paint begins to fail, it may compromise the integrity of the underlying protective coating.

3. Increased Risk of Rust and Corrosion

Garage doors are engineered with protective finishes to guard against moisture, UV exposure, and environmental elements. Painting the door may trap moisture beneath the paint layer and damage or weaken the original protective coating. These factors can accelerate rust formation and corrosion, reducing the lifespan of the door and negatively affecting its structural integrity.

Please be advised that painting the garage door after installation will void any manufacturer's warranty and/or installation warranty relating to:

- Surface finish
- Corrosion or rust protection
- Material defects related to coating performance
- Appearance-related concerns

The installation company, Garage Doors By Dan, shall not be held liable for:

- Poor finish or aesthetic defects resulting from painting after installation,
- Peeling, flaking, or blistering paint
- Rust or corrosion occurring after painting
- Reduced durability or protection from environmental exposure
- Any related damage or deterioration following alteration of the original finish
